Two Ridge women open law practice

She is an active member of the American Civil Liberties Union, and a member of the National Organization for Women (NOW). She is the wife of Mark Mostoller, who is with Oak Ridge National Laboratory. Ms. Stulberg received her bachelors degree from Iowa State University. She received her masters degree from the University of Minnesota and her

She and her husband, Mel Stulberg, who is employed in the biology division of ORNL, have three children, Laurie, 18, who is in her fifth quarter at UT, Lisa, 14, in the ninth grade at Robertsville, and Lynn, 12, in the seventh grade at the same school. She is active in the Community Action Commission, belongs to the League of Women Voters, and is chairman of the Housing Opportunities Made Easier (HOME).
